





MAMAC's IoT based Maverick meters can be deployed over existing campus IT networks. The Maverick meters provide the lowest installed cost solution usually 60-80% lower than other platforms. The Mavericks can be installed and commissioned by in-house facility staff. The visualizer has templates built in and custom graphics can be created by students or staff. No software, no site or user licensing fees, no maintenance contracts, or any other reoccurring costs are involved.




